

# Oklahoma Ethics Commission Rule Amendment: 2021-02 Amendment 3

Modification: Adding a new category of gift as an option for lobbyists, legislative liaisons, and lobbyist principals, and including a base threshold amount for exempting reporting of such gifts to the Commission.

[NOTE: Rule titles are provided for convenience, are not part of the Rules and will be updated as the Rule is modified to reflect the contents of the Rule.]

Rule 5.8 Gift Limits for Legislative Liaison or Legislative Lobbyist.

A. A legislative liaison or a legislative lobbyist may make a gift to the Governor or any legislator or any employee of the Governor or the Legislature in recognition of infrequently occurring occasions of personal significance. The gift shall be given and received contemporaneously with the occasion or at times when such gifts are traditionally given. Such gifts may be made to a family member of the Governor or any legislator or any employee of the Governor or the Legislature, provided such family member is a party to a marriage, serious illness, birth or adoption of a child or retirement. Such gifts to any individual recipient may not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in the aggregate in any calendar year from any legislative liaison or legislative lobbyist.

B. A legislative liaison or legislative lobbyist may provide

books and similar informational materials, including those in

electronic, audio and/or video format, to the Governor, or any 1 Legislator, or any employee of the Governor or Legislature, so long 2 as such materials are related to the recipient's responsibilities 3 as an officer or employee of the State of Oklahoma. Materials 4 provided pursuant to this subsection with an individual item value 5 6 of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or less are not required to be 7 reported to the Commission. 8 Any such qGifts, other than those exempt from reporting С. requirements under Rule 5, shall be reported to the Commission and 9 10 aggregated with meals  $\tau$  and t The aggregate total of meals and other gifts provided to an individual recipient by a legislative 11 liaison or legislative lobbyist may not exceed Five Hundred Dollars 12 (\$500.00). Each gift required to be reported must include the name 13 14 and title of the recipient, date the gift was provided, a 15 description of the gift and occasion for which it was given (if 16 applicable), and the value of the gift. The aggregation and overall gift limit in this subsection does not apply to gifts 17 18 provided pursuant to subsection (B). Rule 5.11. Gift Limits for Executive Lobbyist. 19 A. An executive lobbyist may make a gift to a state officer or 20 employee of an agency for which he or she is registered or should 21 be registered as an executive lobbyist in recognition of 22 infrequently occurring occasions of personal significance. The 23

gift shall be given and received contemporaneously with the occasion or at times when such gifts are traditionally given. gifts may be made to a family member of a state officer or employee of an agency for which he or she is registered or should be registered as an executive lobbyist, provided such family member is a party to a marriage, serious illness, birth or adoption of a child or retirement. Such gifts to any individual recipient may not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in the aggregate in any calendar year from any executive lobbyist. B. An executive lobbyist may provide books and similar informational materials, including those in electronic, audio and/or video format, given to a state officer or employee of an agency for which an executive lobbyist is or should be registered as an executive lobbyist, so long as such materials are related to the recipient's responsibilities as an officer or employee of the State of Oklahoma. Materials provided pursuant to this subsection with an individual item value of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or less are not required to be reported to the Commission. Any such gGifts, other than those exempt from reporting requirements under Rule 5, shall be reported to the Commission and aggregated with meals. $_{7}$  and  $_{t}$  The aggregate total of meals and other gifts provided to an individual recipient by an executive lobbyist may not exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). 1	required to be reported must include the name and title of the
2	recipient, date the gift was provided, a description of the gift
3	and occasion for which it was given (if applicable), and the value
4	of the gift. The aggregation and overall gift limit in this
5	subsection does not apply to gifts provided pursuant to subsection
6	<u>(B).</u>
7	Rule 5.13. Lobbyist Principal Gifts for Public Service to
8	Individual State Officer or Employee
9	$\underline{\text{A.}}$ A lobbyist principal may give a plaque, trophy or similar item
10	suitable for display no more than once per year to a state officer
11	or employee in acknowledgement of the officer or employee's public
12	service, provided the value of the item is no more than Two Hundred
13	Dollars (\$200.00), Such and the gifts is are reported to the
14	<u>Commission</u> on the Legislative Lobbyist Report. No state officer or
15	employee may accept more than one (1) such gift during any calendar
16	year from the same lobbyist principal.
17	B. A lobbyist principal may provide books and similar
18	informational materials, including those in electronic, audio
19	and/or video format, to a state officer or employee so long as such
20	materials are related to the recipient's responsibilities as an
21	officer or employee of the State of Oklahoma. Materials provided
22	pursuant to this subsection with an individual item value of One
23	Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or less are not required to be reported

1	to the Commission. Any gifts required to be reported pursuant to
2	this section are not subject to a limit, but must identify the name
3	of the recipient, a description of the item provided, and the value
4	of the gift.
5	<u>C.</u> A legislative liaison, legislative lobbyist, executive
6	lobbyist or lobbyist principal may provide a gift of any single
7	item with a fair market value not exceeding Ten Dollars (\$10.00) to
8	any state officer or employee, provided that a legislative liaison,
9	legislative lobbyist, executive lobbyist or lobbyist principal
10	shall not make more than one such gift during any calendar year to
11	any state officer or employee. Items given pursuant this
12	subsection are not required to be reported to the Commission.
